
RAIMON PANIKKAR PRIZE

- a cash prize of 1,000 euros

Call for applications

The Raimon Panikkar Prize is an international award instituted by Fundació Vivarium Raimon Panikkar.

Fundació Vivarium Raimon Panikkar, is a non-profit organization founded by Raimon Panikkar himself for promoting interreligious studies. It is the legacy of the Foundation to pursue the aims of its Founder by completing the publication of his writings and, through them, fostering the study of his thought. The Prize is a means to promote the same aims.

This prize is awarded to authors of an original, unpublished study on the thought and works of Raimon Panikkar. The first edition of the prize (2022) was for young scholars writing a study in one of the languages in which Raimon Panikkar's collective works (*Opera Omnia*) have been published (Italian, Catalan, Spanish, French, English). The present edition (2025) is for **scholars** and **students** affiliated with institutions settled in an Asian country.

This Asian edition of the prize is sponsored by **Fundació Vivarium Raimon Panikkar**, **Spain** in collaboration with **Motilal Banarsidass Publications**, **New Delhi**, **India**, which is publishing a wide selection of the *Opera Omnia* in English. Works eligible for this edition of the prize must also be written in English.

The prize will consist in:

(a) for scholars

- the complimentary publication of the study
- the gift of the entire set of volumes of Raimon Panikkar's Opera Omnia (Indian edition)
- a cash prize of 3,000 euros

(b) for students

- an honorable mention of the thesis work as worthy of publication
- the gift of the entire set of volumes of Raimon Panikkar's Opera Omnia (Indian edition)
- a cash prize of 1,000 euros

Eligibility

Admission is reserved for scholars and students affiliated with institutions settled in an Asian country. Affiliation must be certified by the relevant institution.

Indicatively, the study should be around 150 pages, 50,000 words.

The study must be original, unpublished and complete (ready for publication). Uncompleted drafts and course notes shall not be accepted.

Partly published studies or new editions of previously published works shall only be accepted if - at the discretion of the jury - the work has undergone major revision and extension. In this case, the candidate must provide a copy of the previous publication with all relevant details.

Character of the study

The evaluation criteria will be established by the appointed jury. Indicatively the work should include a deep insight of R. Panikkar's thought and perspectives of any application of his vision of reality in the contemporary world, besides having a good linguistic style.

Merely biographical works will not be considered.

Application

Applications must be submitted by e-mail to info@raimon-panikkar.org.

Deadline: November 1^{st,} 2025.

In the application the candidate must include his/her personal details: name and address, age, nationality and affiliation (certified by the relevant institution).

The application must be accompanied by a declaration from the candidate stating that the study is original, unpublished and complete (ready for publication).

The manuscript must be submitted in digital form (PDF format) and sent together with the application by the submission deadline.

Jury

The members of the juries will be eminent experts on the thought and works of Raimon Panikkar, selected and appointed by the Council of the Fundació Vivarium Raimon Panikkar. The judging panel will also include the President of the Foundation and a representative from Motilal Banarsidass Publications.

The jury reserves the right to withhold the prize should none of the submitted studies be considered worthy.

Notification of competition results

All the applicants will receive a notification of the competition results by the end of December 2025.

Awards Ceremony

The awards will be given during an Awards Ceremony to be celebrated in New Delhi. Details will be announced later.
